Far Western University was established in 2010 through legislation passed by the Nepalese government's parliament, officially commencing its operations in 2011 A.D. The university is dedicated to advancing the quality of life in the Far Western region by providing a comprehensive range of educational programs, encompassing general, professional, vocational, and technical fields. Its administrative headquarters are situated in Bhimdatt Municipality within the Kanchanpur district, strategically positioned to serve the Far Western area. Since its inception, Far Western University has been committed to granting the local population access to high quality and globally relevant education, preparing its students to engage with the global community effectively. In its inaugural academic year, the university introduced undergraduate programs within various faculties, including business, education, humanities and social sciences, as well as science and technology. ACADEMICIANS:

SCHOLARSHIP
